Carol Falender, Ph.D., is co-author of *Essentials of the Practice of Competency – based Clinical Supervision* (2016); *Clinical Supervision: A Competency-based Approach* (APA, 2004); and *Getting the Most Out of Clinical Supervision: A Guide for Interns and Trainees* (APA, 2012) with Edward Shafranske; co-editor of *Casebook for Supervision: A Competency-based Approach* (APA, 2008) with Edward Shafranske, and *Multiculturalism and Diversity in Clinical Supervision: A Competency-based Approach* (2014) with Edward Shafranske and Celia Falicov. Dr. Falender was a member of the Supervision Guidelines Group of the Association of State and Provincial Psychology Boards (ASPPB) and Chair of the Supervision Guidelines Task Force of the Board of Educational Affairs (BEA) of APA. She directed APA-approved internship programs at child and family guidance clinics for over twenty years. Dr. Falender is a Fellow of the American Psychological Association (APA).

**Overview:** Clinical supervision is a distinct professional practice. New guidelines and practice standards have been developed that are essential for supervision competence. This course is designed to provide participants a framework of competency-based supervision, including the most current perspectives and developments through vignettes and interactive problem-solving exercises. Content includes a review of targeted areas of supervisory skill, knowledge, and attitudes to focus on enhanced efficacy, technique, and practice. Lecture, discussion, videos, and experiential exercises are included.
